#### Canada's Construction Sector Sees Job Losses in September but Remains Strong Year-Over-Year

Canada's construction sector shed 5,600 jobs in September, marking a 0.5% decline, yet payroll employment remained 0.3% higher compared to September 2023, with 1,171,900 workers on a seasonally adjusted basis. Labour productivity in Canadian businesses declined by 0.4% in Q3 2024, marking the third consecutive quarterly drop, as business output slowed and hours worked increased, while unit labour costs rose by 1.4% due to higher hourly compensation.




## Halt on \$1B Battery Plant in B.C. Amid Market Shifts

### Employers Can Apply for Canada Summer Jobs 2025 Funding: Expand Your Workforce and Support Youth Employment

Employers in housing construction can apply for Canada Summer Jobs 2025 funding **until December 19, 2024**, to hire youth aged 15 to 30 with wage subsidies of up to 50% for private and public organizations, and 100% for non-profits, supporting workforce needs while investing in the next generation of workers.
