November 2024 Building Construction Investment Drops 0.5% Despite Annual Growth

In November 2024, total investment in building construction in Canada declined by 0.5% to \$21.4 billion, driven by a drop in residential investment (-\$168.1 million) despite gains in non-residential construction (+\$71.5 million). British Columbia saw a slight decrease in commercial construction investment (-\$9.5 million) while nationwide single-family home construction rose 2.9%.

Port Alberni, is experiencing a housing shortage as its population grows, with rent prices outpacing incomes and a need for over 1,200 new housing units within five years. The city plans to address this through updated zoning policies and partnerships with private developers, First Nations, and housing organizations.

BC Hydro has finalized 30-year Electricity Purchase Agreements for three wind projects—Brewster, Highland Valley, and Mount Mabel—with a combined capacity of 537 MW, enough to power 157,000 homes annually, in partnership with Indigenous communities holding 51% equity ownership.
